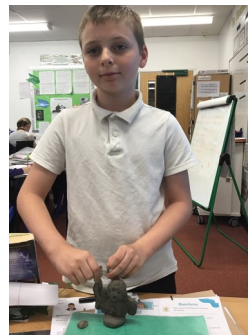
Homework Expectations
