



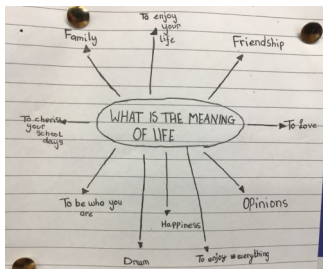

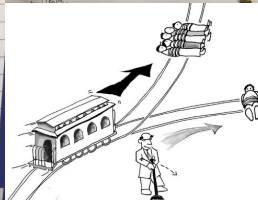
R&W Week 3 - What can we learn about the meaning of life from the great philosophers?

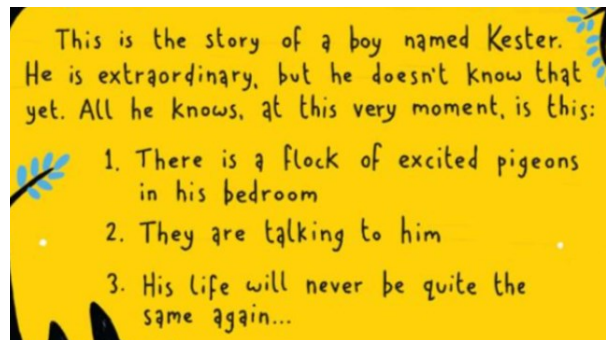


What's looking at the picture and seeing the trolley if I was the person controlling the trolley I would stop at the one person because one life is less valuable than five lives.
