Mastering Number

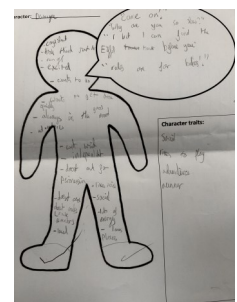
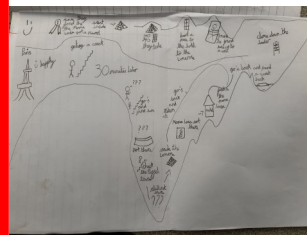

English: Adventure Narrative

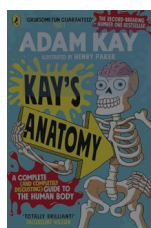
This week, we have begun to plan and develop our own adventure narratives set in Paris. We have planned our plots using a story map and decided on the contrasting characteristics of our two main characters.
