THE MIGHTY MEGALODON

The Megalodon- also known as Carcharocles Megalodon, its Latin name - was the second largest marine animal in the world. This predacious ocean beast first roamed the warm, shallow waters around 17 million years ago. An irascible killing-machine, this marine predator lived a life of solitude. Some scientists say the Megalodon is extinct whilst others say it is still around as we have only explored 20% of the ocean.

BEAUTIFUL OCEANIC LADY



The mighty megalodon was about the second largest marine beast (biggest being the blue whale) measuring at a range of about 40 - 60 feet in length. It is also estimated to weigh around the same as about 30 great white sharks so approximately 50 - 75 tons. Luckily this beast is long gone and you dont have to worry about encountering it!

HOME SWEET HOME

The Megalodon was adapted to the warm, tropical and subtropical parts of the oceans around the world and usually roamed in the shallow warmer areas, this was because it provided a nursery for their mini-mega beasts. By rearing their offspring here, it protected their young from the other predators in the open waters. In fact, fossils from these mighty marine beast have been found in the Indian ocean; the Pacific ocean and many others.

WHAT'S ON THE MENU?

This razor-toothed killing machine is considered to be carnivore (meat eater) because this dangerous fish's diet was expected to be: whales, dolphins, seals and probably other sharks. Although they were the rulers of the sea, it wasn't like that their entire life, because newborn megalodons were estimated to be only about 6 feet long and were often eaten by more of its own kind.
